From the Pastor's Desk...

Celebrating Freedom and Liberty

In the Old Testament we read in the book of Exodus how God's people were set free from their bondage in Egypt. Their freedom was not a result of how smart they were, how good in battle they were, or based on any one particular event that transpired. No, their freedom was a result of the orchestration by God of a series of miracles which God demonstrated to Pharaoh through His servant, Moses.

As the people were freed and they fled Egypt, one would think they would have been oh so thankful to the Lord for His gracious provision of freedom for them. But no, that was not the case as we read in Exodus 16:3, "3 and the people of Israel said to them, "Would that we had died by the hand of the LORD in the land of Egypt, when we sat by the meat pots and ate bread to the full, for you have brought us out into this wilderness to kill this whole assembly with hunger." Again, they cried out in rebellion in Numbers 11:4-5, "4 Now the rabble that was among them had a strong craving. And the people of Israel also wept again and said, "Oh that we had meat to eat! 5 We remember the fish we ate in Egypt that cost nothing, the cucumbers, the melons, the leeks, the onions, and the garlic." And one more time in Numbers 14:3–4, "3 Why is the LORD bringing us into this land, to fall by the sword? Our wives and our little ones will become a prey. Would it not be better for us to go back to Egypt?" 4 And they said to one another, "Let us choose a leader and go back to Egypt." We look at these passages and conclude in our minds, "how ungrateful the children of God were at the freedom God gave them."

Then, we can take time and think about us today, and the freedom that we have in Christ. Let me ask a question, "What do we do with our freedom that God has given us in Christ?" Are we a thankful people, recognizing the price that was paid to give us spiritual liberty? Or are we like the person who upon receiving a hundred dollars complained that he didn't have an envelope to put it in? In Christ and the freedom He offers, do we thank Him, live for Him, and share Him so others can have the same freedom we have? Or, are we like the Israelites who desired, longed for, and had their eyes and heart on returning to from where they had been freed?

As we come to the 4th of July here in America, we once again will recognize all the freedoms that we have, not as a result of our government, but these are God given rights; life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness. And no one can take away what God has given us. No one! So, the Statue of Liberty proclaims to the world our freedom and liberty. Just so, for the Christian, the cross proclaims our freedom and liberty! The price paid for American liberty is in the lives of each who dutifully gave their all to defend our freedoms.

And, in our spiritual freedom and liberty, it comes down to one selfless act, Jesus Christ on Calvary's cross, giving His one life as a ransom to freethe many who are bound in sin and darkness.


MISSIONARY MOMENTS Add them to your prayer list
