From the Pastor's Desk...

Where Do They Start Reading the Bible?

While we have the Bible bookmarks available for reading through the Bible, where does a person who is not a Christian yet is seeking to know more about Jesus and salvation, start in reading the Bible? While it would seem logical to say "start at the beginning, in Genesis" I can tell you what happened when I tried reading the Bible many years ago and started at Genesis. I got through Genesis, and then Exodus, and then got bogged down in Leviticus and somewhere in Numbers I just stopped reading. So clearly, that didn't work for me, and I'm sure there are scores of others who got bogged down in the same manner and stopped reading the Bible altogether.

So, after years of learning and experience I'd like to share one of the most effective ways for a seeker (one who is looking to know more about Jesus) to effectively start reading the Bible. I would suggest they start in the book of John, the fourth book in the New Testament. The book of John was written for a specific purpose and it is found in John 20:30-31, "30 Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of the disciples, which are not written in this book; 31 but these are written so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in his name." Therein is the key and reason for a seeker to read John - that Jesus would reveal Himself to the person in a mighty way. In fact, once this has been recommended to someone as a reading suggestion, I suggest you pray for that person, that they will have the Holy Spirit open their eyes and heart to exactly who Jesus is and the difference He can make in their life.

As people read through John, going from the beginning with Jesus in heaven, to his birth through the incarnation, and then his first miracle at the wedding in Cana - event by event the Holy Spirit can and will open the eyes of the person reading to exactly who Jesus claimed to be; the sinless Son of God. And then as they continue through with miracle after miracle, they will see the power and majesty associated with Jesus. And finally, there is the cross and the sacrifice Jesus made for the sin of the world followed by the resurrection! Each chapter and each verse is slowly revealing the facets of Jesus, taking Him from being a teacher to being who He is revealed to be, the Christ, the Son of God, along with showing the need for each to know Him in a personal way.

What starts out as simply reading the Bible, the book of John, becomes a journey through His story. This revelation will engage, challenge, and hopefully bring a person to repentance and then a commitment to a lifelong walk with Jesus. This accomplishes the goal for the reader as well as the goal John had in writing the book; "but these are written so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in his name."


